

Foreword

Youth Parliament Pakistan is a platform for Pakistani Youth patterned after the National Assembly of Pakistan with 48 members from all over the country. The Youth Parliament membership is selected from across the country for a one-year term.


PILDAT formed the first-ever Youth Parliament of Pakistan in the year 2007. After the successful completion of the first and second Youth Parliaments, PILDAT has now launched the third term: **Youth Parliament Pakistan 2009-2010**.

Establishment and facilitation of the Youth Parliament is part of PILDAT's focus on Youth in the country and Youth's awareness education and training in the norms of politics and democracy in the country. PILDAT strongly feels that sustainable democracy and the sustainability of sound democratic institutions in Pakistan is not possible without youth's involvement in the democratic and political process even if this involvement is simply as a citizen or voter.

The Youth Parliament Pakistan has its own **2-Party system**, the **Leader of the House** and the **Leader of the Opposition**, a **Youth Cabinet**, a **Shadow Cabinet** and **Parliamentary Committees**. The Youth Parliament Pakistan project is conceived, planned and implemented by PILDAT while it has been supported by the UK Government's **Strategic Priority Fund** of the **UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office**, the **Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation** and the **US Embassy**, **Islamabad** as recognition of the importance of young people's involvement in democracy and democratic practices. For Youth Parliament Pakistan 2008-2009, PILDAT has also sought and received the support of some individual and corporate sponsors for those members duly acknowledged within this booklet.



Why a Youth Parliament?

Pakistan needs to strengthen its democratic institutions and inculcate democratic culture in the society. We need to discourage extremist tendencies and lack of tolerance for others' beliefs and views and strengthen the rule of law. Open and informed debate on issues facing the society should be promoted. The society should develop tools, mechanisms and systems which can facilitate the exposure of democratic system to its citizens from an early stage.

Youth Parliament Pakistan

The question Pakistani society faces is that how do we deepen our understanding of parliamentary democracy, and uphold and advance its practice in Pakistan? PILDAT, as an organisation committed to strengthening democracy and democratic institutions in Pakistan, feels that it is necessary to engage the Pakistani Youth in healthy discourse and expose them to democratic traditions and culture so that they may be groomed as a civilised, tolerant and peaceful citizens. The concept of Youth Parliament emerged as a way for young people to "learn by doing," through taking part in Youth Parliament. It was felt that practice on the benches of a mock Parliament can be useful in deciding how to become a more active citizen, either inside or outside formal politics.

The project of Youth Parliament is seen as a way to inculcate democratic culture in Pakistani Youth and to facilitate free but structured expression of their views. The Youth Parliament is also seen as a key towards achieving the objective of support for democracy and growth and sustenance of democratic institutions in Pakistan.

The first-ever Youth Parliament Pakistan, established in 2007 for a one-year term, proved as a great platform through which a representative section of the Youth of Pakistan practiced and experienced life under a political and parliamentary spotlight. The young members of

Youth Parliament Pakistan chose political association. elected their Youth Prime Minister and Leader of the Opposition, a Youth Cabinet and a Shadow Cabinet. debated public policy issues, worked in Parliamentary Committees and gave their detailed input to some of they key policies of the Government of Pakistan such as the Draft Youth Policy, proposed legislation on Provincial Autonomy and a host of other issues. The voung members, drawn from across a cross-section of socio-political and economic spectrum of Pakistan. learnt and practiced how to prepare and move legislation, how to enlist support of their fellow members on their bills and resolutions in the House and how to reach consensus and compromise through the use of conversation, dialogue and understanding of the others' concerns, views and perspectives. The vibrant membership of the Youth Parliament Pakistan 2007 concluded its work gloriously through preparing and launching a Youth Manifesto 2007 to articulate Pakistani Youth's perspective on key issues.

The Youth Parliament Pakistan 2008-2009 discussed and presented youth perspectives on national policies. It has been a great honour for Youth Parliament Pakistan that **Prime Minister of Pakistan Mr. Yusuf Raza Gilani** invited two representatives of Youth Parliament to present their views on draft National Education Policy in the Federal Cabinet meeting that was held on September 09, 2009.



Objectives


The specific objectives of Youth Parliament Pakistan are to educate Pakistani Youth about politics and democracy and to demonstrate to them how Parliaments are able:

- to make legislation;
- to debate matters of national and international concern;
- to demand accountability from those in government;
- to discuss matters in committees;
- to change government without

recourse to civil disorder; and

• to make and enforce their own rules of conduct.

In addition, we expect the Youth Parliament to become a useful forum to voice views of the Youth about a range of international and national issues. The debates in the Youth Parliament will not only help the young members in their personal development as a useful citizen, it will also serve the purpose of articulating views of the youth on vital issues facing the nation and conveying these to the Government and Society at large.



1st Batch of Youth Parliament Pakistan: 2007

The first-ever Youth Parliament Pakistan was inaugurated in January 2007 and met in Islamabad during six separate sessions from January to December of 2007. Sixty (60) members of Youth Parliament or MYPs were selected from across the country representing all provinces, areas and territories of Pakistan. The seats were divided among these areas on the basis of population criteria used by the National Assembly of Pakistan; however 1 seat each was given to Azad Jammu Kashmir and Northern Areas as well.


Gender profile of Youth Parliament 2007 stood at 72% Male and 28% Females on open merit. The Blue Party (Liberal) formed a majority in the Youth Parliament 2007 bagging 36 seats as opposed to 24 seats held by the Green Party. Two of the key portfolios that of the Deputy Speaker Youth Parliament and the Leader of the Opposition- were also won and retained by the female members of the Youth Parliament 2007.

Over the course of the year, the members of the Youth Parliament 2007 met and interacted with the **Prime Minister of Pakistan**, the **Chief Justice of Pakistan**, the **Leader of the Opposition in the Senate**, **Chairman of the Senate's Foreign Affairs Committee**, the **former Governor of the State Bank**, the **British High Commissioner**, as well as a long list of Cabinet Ministers and political leaders. The MYPs also had a chance to meet with and were addressed by the **British** Foreign Secretary Mr. David Miliband during his first trip to Pakistan.

As a forum of the Youth, it was mainly up to the MYPs to set the agenda and calendar of the sessions of Youth Parliament. Like the National Assembly of Pakistan, the Youth Parliament also had a Business Advisory Committee which decided the calendar and topics of the Youth Parliament sessions.

The Youth Parliament Pakistan gave its input to the Government of Pakistan on draft Youth Policy as well as prepared and launched Youth Manifesto 2007 to articulate Pakistani Youth's perspective on key issues ranging from Provincial Autonomy to Local Government System; Free and Fair Elections to Law and Order; Combating Extremism and Terrorism to Economy and Agricultural Development; International Relations to Education and Health, etc. in addition to Environment, Culture, Women, Recreation and Sport, Juvenile Justice and Empowerment of Youth in Rural Areas.

Towards the end of the Youth Parliament 2007, the batch of MYPs of 2007, together with PILDAT's consultation formed the Youth Parliament Alumni Association (YPAA) as an independent body of alumni that would serve as a way of keeping all the members in touch with each other after they have served a term as MYPs.



2nd Batch of Youth Parliament Pakistan: 2008-2009

The second Youth Parliament consisted of 62 members from across Pakistan. Gender profile of the Youth Parliament Pakistan 2008-2009 represented 80% Male and 20% Female on open merit.

MYPs engaged in debate on topics ranging from treatment of Pakistani students in Britain, to the trial of former President General Pervez Musharaf, dialogue versus military action on containing militancy; Education Policy and Media Policy, etc.

Recognition of Youth Parliament input to Policy at the Highest Level

The Youth Parliament Pakistan discusses and presents youth perspectives on national policies. It has been a great honour for Youth Parliament Pakistan that **Prime Minister of Pakistan Mr. Yusuf Raza Gilani** invited two representatives of Youth Parliament to present their views on draft National Education Policy in the Federal Cabinet meeting held on September 09, 2009.

The second batch of Youth Parliament was addressed by the **President** and **Prime Minister of Pakistan**; **Foreign Minister of Pakistan**; **Information Minister of Pakistan**, leading media and political personalities and many local and foreign Members of Parliament, dignitaries and the like.

A Study visit to UK for the selected members of the

Youth Parliament 2008-2009 and a **Crisis Management Simulation Exercise** have been the major highlights of the Youth Parliament calendar 2008-2009.

The Study Visit, the objective of which was to understand the working of the British Political System and engage in a meaningful dialogue with the British vouth counterparts, especially the Pakistani Diaspora. on issues of mutual concern and interest, provided opportunities to the delegates to understand the working of the British Parliament and various political parties, especially the key political parties and their vouth affiliates such as the Labour Students and the Conservative Future, interact with the British youth organizations and engage in a dialogue with the Pakistani-origin and Muslim community organizations active in the UK, how civil society organizations hold the democratic system and the government to account or lobby for various causes such as the environment and the human rights, how the executive branch works and how media freedom is protected in the UK, etc.

The Crisis Management Simulation Exercises were especially designed to develop sharp leadership skills among MYPs. Each exercise which involved a set of MYPs, was conducted by an expert in the presence of an observer well-versed with the process and gave MYPs a crisis situation to develop their solutions. Key Features of Youth Parliament Pakistan 2009-2010

As a model Parliament for young people, the Youth Parliament Pakistan is patterned after the National Assembly of Pakistan although its membership is smaller than that of the National Assembly. Wherever possible, the Youth Parliament follows the rules of procedures as close to the National Assembly as practical. However, better practices from other Parliaments are adopted to expose Pakistani Youth to better Parliamentary practices.

Membership

The total membership of Youth Parliament 2009-2010 is 48. The seats have been divided among these areas on the basis of population criteria used by the National Assembly of Pakistan, however one seat each is given to Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan in the Youth Parliament Pakistan. The breakdown of the membership is as follows:

Age

Only those young Pakistanis who were between the ages of 18-29 years on August 01, 2009 were eligible to apply for membership of the Youth Parliament.

Secretariat of the Youth Parliament

As the organisation which conceived the idea of Youth Parliament Pakistan, PILDAT is the project implementer and acts as the Secretariat of the Youth Parliament.

Members' Political Affiliation

There is no bar on the actual political affiliation of the members of the Youth Parliament. However, Youth Parliament has two mock political parties: the Blue Party and the Green Party and members are asked to join either one of the two political parties for the purpose of Youth Parliament. Joining one of the parties is obligatory for members.

Minimum Work Days

The Youth Parliament will meet for at least 30 days in a year.

The Selection Process

The process of selection of participants for the Youth Parliament has been multi-tiered and involved the following steps:

- 1. Placing of Advertisement in nationwide editions of two of the largest circulating English and Urdu daily newspapers of the country as well as advertisements on TV. The Jang Group of Newspapers and the Geo Network partnered with PILDAT in the advertising campaign
- 2. Submission of Expression of Interest by interested candidates
- 3. Internal review of Expressions of Interest and short-listing for Interviews
- 4. Calls for Interviews to short-listed candidates
- 5. Selection Interviews by Youth Parliament Steering Committee
- 6. Selection Calls and Invitations for becoming Members of Youth Parliament

Selection Criteria

Following criteria for selection has been adopted:

- 1. Interested candidates should be citizens of Pakistan or holders of Pakistani Origin Card in the case of Overseas Pakistanis
- 2. Age of interested candidates should not be less than 18 years and more than 29 years on August 01, 2009
- 3. Interested candidates should be able to read and write Urdu
- 4. There should be no criminal record against interested candidates in Pakistan or abroad

Efforts have been made to ensure that all provinces and territories of Pakistan and Azad Kashmir are represented in the finally selected members including adequate representation to women and non-Muslim applicants.
